

Offering A Revival - Life Group Questions

1. Do you believe that it is feasible to consistently live as though Jesus was coming back tomorrow? Why or why not?
2. What are a few practical steps that you could take to help shape your life in a way that reflects the idea that "the time is near?"
3. Pastor Dan shared that God's heart is patient because of His passion for people to be reconciled to Himself. How closely does the Church's passion for the lost look like God's passion for the lost? More personally, what keeps your passion for the lost from looking more like God's passion for the lost?
4. What are your thoughts on the statement that revival cannot come until we see ourselves the way that Christ sees us? What are some aspects of your life that God may want you to see differently (things you think are strengths that may actually be weaknesses or vice versa)?
5. We cannot make an impact for Christ if we do not have intimacy with Christ. What emotions do you experience when you think about intimacy with Christ (joy, expectancy, nervousness, fear, hope, etc)? Why is that?

FYM Focus:

1. God's passion for your neighbors is what makes Him patient to return. How would you characterize your passion for your neighbors? (there is no condemnation, so be honest)
2. Pastor Dan said that God's work of salvation/reconciliation is a work that He is doing through His church. What is one thing that you can do this week to join God in this work?
3. Sometimes we think passion must be present before we'll join in the work. Do you think that it's possible that if we join our Father in the work (pray first, love all, invite often) that our passion will grow? Why or why not?
