

If You Know Be Still - Life Group Questions

1. Pastor Dan opened his message by talking about the tendency for long time Christians to take their eyes off of Jesus and begin to pursue things that don't really bring life (political power, FaceBook battles, comfort and control, collection of stuff, etc). Where have you seen this tendency in your own life?
2. How well would you say that you know Jesus? This isn't a question about how many facts you know about Him or how well you can describe the time table of His life. How well would you say that you personally know Jesus? What makes you give that answer?
3. In both the story of the storm and the story of the man who was possessed by a legion of demons Jesus brings salvation and peace with a word. God speaks to the storm and it becomes still and He speaks to the demons and they flee. What happens when he speaks to us?
4. In the story of the demon possessed man the townspeople ask Jesus to leave because they were afraid. Pastor Dan made the statement that if we're more afraid of what we'll lose if Jesus stays than we are of what we'll lose if He leaves, we don't know Jesus the way that we should. Are there points of fear in your relationship with Jesus (what He'll ask me to do, what He'll ask me to give up, etc)?

Front Yard Mission Questions:

1. Do you find yourself getting so busy with the rest of life that you find yourself taking your eyes off of your FYM? How can we intentionally continue to create space to love and serve our neighbors?
2. What are some ways that you have wondered if you know Jesus well enough to help make him known to your neighbors? Have you ever found that idea to be intimidating? How can we help each other get past that intimidation?
3. What practical step can you take this week to love and serve your neighbors?
