There Has To Be More: Resurrection Results

1 Corinthians 15

- 1. This wasn't the typical Palm Sunday message. Did you miss having a typical Palm Sunday sermon, or is that kind of thing even on your radar?
- 2. Stac said that knowing the end of the story changes our interaction with the story. How does knowing the end of the Resurrection Story change things for you?
- 3. Lord of the Rings: book or movie? both or neither? Never seen 'em or nerd-level love?
- 4. We live in the digital age; What's the most important message that you've ever received by text? Was it good news or bad news?
- 5. It's been said that the resurrection of Jesus is the most important event in human history. Why did Paul tell the church at Corinth that this was the most important part of his teaching?
- 6. Paul calls Jesus the *firstfruits of the resurrection* (1 Cor 15:20). What are firstfruits, and what do they tell us about the rest of the harvest? What does that mean for us?
- 7. Stac made a big deal out of the fact that **we are loved**. How could that simple fact change a person's life? Has it changed your life, and if so, how?
- 8. Come up with a list of things that are **steadfast** and **immovable**. How could first-century followers of Jesus display those qualities? What would those qualities look like in the lives of Christ followers today? Do those words describe you, your lifegroup, your family...
- 9. **Abounding in the work of the Lord...**do a quick review of the things that describe the purpose and passion of Jesus. Why did he come, and what did he do? You can read Mark 1:38; Mark 10:45; Luke 19:10; John 9:39; John 10:10; 1 Timothy 1:15; 1 John 3:8 for little refresher, and add anything that also fits.
- 10. What can you do this week that will move you a step closer to abounding in the work of the Lord?
- 11. What have you done to embrace the call of God to be a missionary (sent one) to your front yard? What could you do, and when are you going to do it?
