## LifeGroup Questions Into the Wilderness #5 – So Send I You

- 1. Read John 20:21-22 Jesus said, "As the Father has sent me, even so send I you." If Jesus is the model of our "sending." What does that mean for us? What do we learn from his life as one sent on a mission from God, that we can apply to our own life?
- 2. What impacted you the most about the David and Svea Flood story?
- 3. Thinking of the wilderness and the Flood story, Dan said, "Perhaps this is one of our fears. The minute I tell Jesus yes, life will get hard. He'll drive me into the wilderness and abandon me. In the middle of my wilderness, I'll lose everything. Have you ever entertained that fear? Why?
- 4. Read Luke 4:14-19. Dan compared this passage to Jesus' teaching on prayer that we should pray for God's Kingdom to come and His will to be done on earth as it is in heaven. Make it down here like it is up there. As Jesus' describes his mission what connects with, excites you this most? What part of his mission do you want to join?
- 5. Looking at John 20:21-22 & Luke 4:14-19, Dan said that when people looked at Jesus they saw the one who sent Him. What do people see when they look at us?
- 6. As we look at the Palm Sunday story in Luke 19, Dan developed three ways that Jesus is sent into the city: a. On the back of humble service; b. With unstoppable shouts of Glory; c. With Tears of Compassion. Which of those three best describe you as one who is sent and which one least describes you?
- 7. Do you truly believe that being "on mission" for God is the best way to find joy and peace and a life that truly satisfies? Why or why not?
