

LifeGroup Questions -- I Am the Project #4
I Timothy 2:1-4; Colossians 4:2; Luke 10:1-2

1. Dan talked about Roald Amundsen's intense commitment to preparation for his mission. What are some ways that you've been preparing, or even better...what are some ways that God has been preparing you for a front-yard mission?

2. If you were to have a gospel-conversation with someone on your hashtag, the best place to start is where God is making a difference in your life. Lifechange is part of your gospel story. How is God making a difference in your life?

3. Read John 17:18 and Acts 20:24. Then read Luke 10. Do you think we have been given the same (or at least a similar) mission as that of Paul, and Jesus first disciples? Why or why not? What keeps us from embracing the mission of God?

4. Read 1 Timothy 2:1-4. Which part of Paul's instructions impact you the most? Do you think it's impossible, difficult or unlikely that we could pray for ALL the people in Central PA? How do we get started?

5. Notice that Paul ties "all-prayer" to God wanting all to be saved. What does this suggest to you? If we do commit to praying for our neighbors, how should we pray for them? What do we pray for if we don't know their needs?

6. Ed Silviso said that we should pray for those in authority, because sometimes they are in a unique place of really seeing how the need is beyond their capacity to meet it...it puts them in a place that is open to prayer. Do you think that's true? How could we practice that?

7. What would (or does) it look like in your life to be devoted to prayer?

8. What besides “citizen of heaven” defines your identity?
